### Grand Council of the Crees (Eeyou Istchee)/Cree Nation Government Pays Homage to Former Premier Bernard Landry Following his Passing

**Nemaska, Eeyou Istchee (November 7, 2018)** – The Cree Nation Government is saddened by the loss of former Premier Bernard Landry. The province, as well as the Cree Nation, has lost a man of great vision and conviction.

Over the years, the Cree Nation and Mr. Landry forged a relationship transcending different cultures and languages. Their shared vision was of a Nation-to-Nation relationship between the Cree and Québec based on principles of mutual respect and collaboration for the benefit of both nations. With his unwavering belief in these principles, Mr. Landry showed true leadership in showing the way to a new and positive relationship between Québec and Indigenous peoples.
