Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay

The Cree Board of Health confirms that another individual has recently tested positive for a total of four (4) individuals in Eeyou Istchee.

The recent case involved a youth that had travelled to Montreal from Chisasibi for a medical appointment. Tracing and testing have been completed by the Health Board and the individual has been isolated. The person who acted as the chaperon for the individual has tested negative reinforcing the containment of the case. The young person who already had underlying health issues has been transferred by air ambulance from Chisasibi to Montreal where they are being isolated and receiving special care.

- 127 tests have been carried out
- 88 tests have returned negative
- 35 awaiting for results, these individuals are required to self-isolate while they await results.

Turnaround is greatly improved with results being delivered in less than 36 hours. The Cree Board of Health has been implementing the Emergency Preparedness plan and remains confident they are able to manage the current pandemic. The Cree Board of Health has also taken special care to adapt all their air travel to ensure that the staff coming North do not represent a risk by properly screening them and adapting the airport facilities to ensure that there is no public traffic.

Cree School Board

The Cree School Board would like to remind parents and students to go www.eeyoueducation.ca/youth/students/olp as many supplementary resources now available for online learning for elementary and I-IV secondary students. The secondary V Online Learning Platform will be launched this week to help students to graduate on time.

The Cree School Board is working hard on plans for the reopening of schools and the return staff. Special measures are being implemented to ensure everyone's safety when introducing all staff back into the communities.

Eeyou Eenou Police Force

The Eeyou Eenou Police Force continue to implement the social distancing requirements having issued 88 tickets over the last few days. The Police warned that repeat offenders or those who refuse to comply with restrictions on social gathering and distancing will be facing criminal prosecutions.

It is important people realize the social distancing requirements are not about punishing them but represent an important contribution by every individual to save as many lives as possible during this pandemic.
