

Message from Leadership

- Unfortunately, there were two “super spreader” events related to social gatherings in the Ouje-Bougoumou, Chibougamau, Mistissini area which has resulted in 30 confirmed cases, with 13 among residents of Ouje-Bougoumou and 10 among residents of Mistissini so far. There is reason to be hopeful that with the incredible contact tracing efforts of the Cree Health Board, the leadership of local governments in implementing restrictions and controlling gatherings and most importantly the cooperation of youth and community members in coming forward in contact tracing that we will be able to contain these cases very quickly.
- More than 200 people are part of the contact tracing exercise and many are testing negative which demonstrates that the Cree Health Board Contact Tracing teams are finding the ends of the transmission chains. Recent events are a demonstration to everyone on how one lapse in judgement can have an impact on so many in our communities. Although two elders have been infected by these events there is a reason to be hopeful as severe symptoms have been very limited thus far. Let us pray that it stays this way in the coming days.
- The Cree Health Board has made a great achievement by administering more than 1,000 doses in less than 5 days. This is a demonstration that the Cree Nation is ready for the doses to begin vaccination in all communities, which are expected to arrive as early as the 14th, of January, 2021.

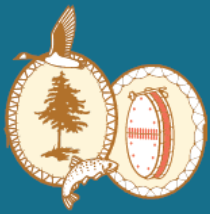

Travelling

With the “Lockdown” measures that were announced by the Government of Quebec closing all non-essential services outside Eeyou Istchee this week, **there is NO reason for people to be traveling outside of a Cree community for non-essential purposes.**

Considering the different phases of the communities of Nemaska, Mistissini, Oujé-Bougoumou and Waswanipi, and the need to assist the Cree Health Board in bringing the current cases under control as quickly as possible: **All Cree leaders are calling for an immediate restriction on all non-Essential inter community travel until further notice.**

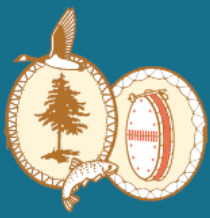

Eeyou Istchee Deconfinement Plan

Due to the different levels of risk that communities are exposed to, we have a number of communities at different phases.

PHASE 3

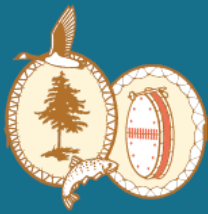
- Outdoor gatherings 75 or 10 households
- Indoor gathering 25 or 3 households (This limitation applies to indoor private gatherings and indoor public events, such as sporting events)
- There is no need to close offices in Eeyou Istchee so long as the proper precautionary measures are maintained.

PHASE 2

- Outdoor gatherings 2 households maximum.
- Indoor gathering same 2 households at all times.
- There is no need to close offices in Eeyou Istchee so long as the proper precautionary measures are maintained.

PHASE 1

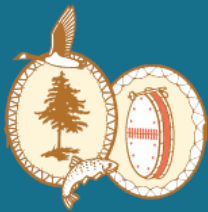
- Prohibition on gatherings indoor and outdoor.
- Public buildings are upon appointment only.
- Access to and from the community is restricted to essential services only.

Education

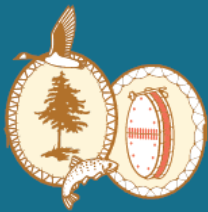
Due to the current situation of cases among the inland communities the following immediate measures are being taken:

- Mistissini, Nemaska, Oujé-Bougoumou and Waswanipi: The beginning of in-class instruction will be postponed for 2 weeks;
- Whapmagoostui, Chisasibi, Wemindji, Eastmain and Waskaganish: The beginning of in-class instruction will be postponed by 1 week

Students will be expected to work on the homework packages that they were issued before the Christmas holidays or contact the school for how to retrieve the packages for those that do not have them.

Day Cares

For the communities of Mistissini and Ouje-Bougoumou daycares are open for essential workers only. In the other communities daycares function normally according to the applicable deconfinement phase.
