

Message from Leadership

While the epidemiological situation regarding COVID-19 is still improving in Quebec, it is important for the Cree Nation to keep in mind that until more people get vaccinated and until it is made possible to vaccinate young children, efforts will be needed to continue to protect the communities from the threat of COVID-19 and its variants. This means continuing to abide by the sanitary measures in the communities and also while travelling outside Eeyou Istchee.

When travelling back into the communities of Eeyou Istchee, people are encouraged to get tested, especially for those not fully vaccinated. Now that gargle testing is made available at all communities' clinics, it provides for a less intrusive way to get tested and monitor the presence of COVID-19 in our communities. Testing remains crucial to help the Public Health Department of the Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay making recommendations.

Prior to travelling, people are also encouraged to contact their local Public Safety Officer to confirm the applicable rules they will have to follow upon their return from their destination.

Effective June 15, 2021, fully vaccinated individuals (defined as upon reception of 2nd dose) are exempt from any isolation requirements including when returning from travel from anywhere outside the communities of Eeyou Istchee.

Deconfinement in Eeyou Istchee v. Quebec in General

Until a more significant portion of the population is vaccinated there will still need to be restrictions on gathering inside Eeyou Istchee, however, because the Cree Nation has demonstrated incredible discipline and made great sacrifices we can enjoy the most relaxed confinement measures in Quebec at this time:

Areas of Risk

<u>Unvaccinated travellers</u> still represent a very real risk to the vulnerable members of our community when they arrive from an area of risk. The distinguishing factor that has kept the Cree Nation safer than any other jurisdictions has been the Mandatory Self-Isolation Laws of Eeyou Istchee where travellers who represented a risk isolated (presently 10 days) upon return to protect the vulnerable members of the community.
