

### Introduction

The Cree Health Board continues to encourage vaccination for the 12-39 age group in Eeyou Istchee. Local CMCs and schools will continue to offer vaccination clinics to help raise the percentage of total vaccinated individuals. Reducing transmission and infections from COVID-19 also relieves pressure on our local health services.

### Status of Cases

There are currently **NO** active cases within Region 18 – Eeyou Istchee.

One (1) case at Espresso Hotel involving a patient who travelled from Waskaganish to Montreal early last week has been confirmed. All contacts are now in isolation and closely monitored.

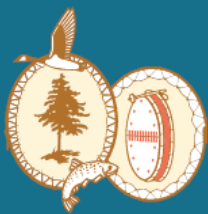
### Education

Cree School Board buildings remain closed to the general public. Employees in all facilities continue to follow public health measures, including completing daily health checks and wearing face coverings in shared areas.

Schools and adult education facilities continue to operate safely, with COVID-19 measures in place. Post-Secondary Student Services continues to support students studying outside of the communities, as well as those completing their studies remotely from home.

Youth sector schools are working in collaboration with public health to support vaccination efforts in schools/communities where higher vaccination rates are needed.

### TRAVEL

Travel to an Area of Risk will require self-isolation:

- Fully vaccinated – 7 days with a test on Day 5
- Partially vaccinated or unvaccinated – 10 days with a test between day 5-7

### PROOF OF VACCINATION (Vaccine Passport):

As of September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 proof of vaccination/vaccine passport will be required for modes of travel and to access certain public areas in Quebec. To obtain your proof of vaccination please consult the site and info below:
