 - Special Working Group on Cree Nation Education Act
 - Special Working Group on Cree Nation Health Act

2025-11 Support for the Cree Trappers' Association

- Discussions have been maintained with the Cree Trappers' Association during the transition of leadership of the Association and the Cree Nation Government.
- A directive has been issued to the Departments of Commerce and Industry and the Department of Social and Cultural Development to convene meetings between Economic Security Program Administration, Niskamoon Corporation, Cree Trappers' Associations, Board of Compensation/CREECO, Cree Development Corporation, James Bay Eeyou Compane, Cree Health Board to undertake an assessment of existing programs for assisting land users and report back to Board/cCouncil.

2025-12 Follow-Up on Annual General Assembly Resolutions

- Annual General Assembly Resolutions are tabled at the first Board/Council after the assembly where they are reviewed and the required directives are issued or resolutions adopted.

2025-13 Cree Youth Protection Commissioners Report

- The report went beyond the mandate of any one entity and has been the discussion at regular meetings between the Cree Nation Government, Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay and the Cree School Board.
- Much of the content of the report was also the subject of the CONNECT Forum held with all Cree leaders of Eeyou Istchee in March 2025 resulting in numerous calls to action.

2025-14 Prioritizing Miyupimaatisuiin in Eeyou/Eenou Istchee

- The call for a cross-entity emergency working committee was addressed through the direct involvement of local and regional leadership at the CONNECT Forum of March 2025 and the regular meetings between the Cree Nation Government, Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay and the Cree School Board.

2025-15 Youth Transitional Housing – Infrastructure and Program Investment

- The Cree Nation Special Working Group on Housing was created and has been mandated on the development of programs to facilitate young families and youth accessing housing.

2025-16 Expansion of the CNG Private Home Program

- The Cree Nation Special Working Group on Housing has been directed and mandated to address the matter and has increased the private housing subsidy and is examining measures to reduce the administrative burdens on prospective homeowners and local governments.

2025-17 Review and Compliance of Agreements with Cree Nation

- The current negotiations with the Government of Canada on the renewal of the Cree Canada Agreement is resulting in a review of the status of funding and allocation of funds in Eeyou Istchee.

2025-18 Mandate for Cree Nation Government to Order a Review of the Economic Security Program Agreement

- Discussions have begun with the administration of the Economic Security Program to assess the successes and deficiencies of the program and initiate discussions with the Government of Quebec to remove punitive aspects of the program and increase benefits where possible.

2025-19 Route du Nord and Billy Diamond Highway

- Formal discussion have been initiated with the Ministry of Transport which is preparing to take responsibility for the Billy Diamond Highway and has current responsibility for a portion of the Route du Nord. Having all highways consolidated in one Ministry will assist in discussions on upgrading and maintenance of the Highways.

RESOLUTION AGA 2025-16

SUBJECT: Expansion of the CNG Private Home Program

WHEREAS the Cree Communities through the Cree Nation Government has a Private Home Ownership Program.

WHEREAS the Cree Nation Government's Private Home Ownership Program has not been able to accommodate the current realities of the members, resulting in underutilization of available funds.

WHEREAS the lack of participation in the private home ownership program is aggravating the strain on the community social housing program.

WHEREAS the Cree Nation Private Home Ownership could address access to capital barriers and affordability barriers through cooperatives, no interest loans, forgivable grants and other financial instruments to ensure consistent, equitable and appropriately indexed long term funding is available.

WHEREAS the Chiefs of the communities through its Assembly of the Cree Nations hereby wishes to expand the Private Home Program to include Rent-to-Own to expand the reach for private home ownership, and reduce the strain on social housing.

BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT the Assembly is requesting to have a rent-to-own program developed and implemented by April 1, 2026.

THAT the Cree Nation Government is hereby mandated to do all things deemed necessary to give effect to the foregoing and give appropriate directives to their Departments to work towards the realization of this objective, and for the Cree Nation Government to report back to the Board Council on progress.

BE IT RESOLVED:

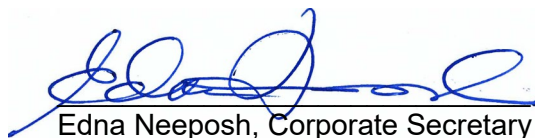
